



**2022 PRIMARY SCHOOL LEAVING EXAMINATION
INSTRUCTIONS TO SCHOOL CANDIDATES [Version dated 23 June 2022]**

**(for PSLE Written/Listening Comprehension (LC) Examinations to be conducted from
16 September 2022)**

1. Please read the **Instructions for Candidates** which are found on the SEAB website www.seab.gov.sg before your first paper.
2. Please **do not report for examination** and **do inform** your teacher, if you are a confirmed COVID-19 case. You should follow MOH's Health Protocols to self isolate for 72 hours or see a doctor if you are unwell.
3. On Medical Leave due to Acute Respiratory Infection (ARI) / fever
 - 3.1 You will be allowed to sit for the examination if you are visibly well (no fever, not showing ARI symptoms).
 - 3.2 Candidates who are unwell, especially if displaying respiratory symptoms such as runny nose, cough or sore throat, should see a doctor at a polyclinic or a designated General Practitioner (GP) clinic participating in the Swab-and-Send-Home (SASH) initiative, preferably in the morning. A list of GP clinics participating in the SASH initiative can be found at the following website: www.phpc.gov.sg.
 - 3.3 If you **display symptoms less than four days before the examination**, as well as in **between different examination dates**, you should seek medical attention at polyclinics to ensure timely diagnosis.
4. On Stay Home Notice (SHN) served by ICA

You must inform your school immediately if you are serving SHN issued by ICA during the examination period. Your school will then advise you on the detailed arrangements for you to sit for the national examination during your SHN period.
5. If you are unable to sit for papers in the national examinations due to COVID-19, special consideration will be granted. Your school will make the application for you. In awarding a grade, we will take into consideration multiple sources of evidence, such as your performance in the other papers for that affected subject in the national and school-based examinations as well as the school cohort's performance in the national and school-based examinations.



Safe Management Measures for the Conduct of National Examinations

6. You must wear surgical masks or reusable masks of equivalent effectiveness at all times. Refusal to put on a face mask is an offence in Singapore under the COVID-19 (Temporary Measures) Act. Do note that the invigilator may ask you to remove your mask to verify your identity when taking attendance.
7. If you are not well, such as having a fever and flu-like symptoms, do not report for examination and inform your teacher.
8. You will be seated at least 1.2m apart from another candidate.
9. If you are unwell during the examination, please inform an examination personnel immediately. The school leaders will assess your condition and decide on appropriate measures such as making arrangement for you to see a doctor or to send you home.
10. Invigilators will maintain a safe distance from the candidates, except during issuing of Question Papers, verifying attendance, and collecting answer scripts.
11. You can refer to the SEAB website: www.seab.gov.sg for more information on the examination rules and regulations, as well as the arrangements for candidates who are affected by COVID-19 and other major disruption during examination days.

SEAB will continue to monitor the COVID-19 situation and update schools if there are any changes to the safe management measures. You must observe and comply with any additional instructions and procedures that SEAB may announce nearer to the examination dates. You should refer to SEAB website at www.seab.gov.sg regularly for updates of instructions and procedures before you proceed to sit for your examination.
