RELEASE OF THE 2020 SINGAPORE-CAMBRIDGE GCE A-LEVEL EXAMINATION RESULTS

1. Candidates who sat for the 2020 Singapore-Cambridge General Certificate of Education Advanced Level (GCE A-Level) examination received their results today¹.
2. Given the COVID-19 situation, arrangements have been made for school candidates to receive their results from their respective schools with safe management measures in place. Private candidates will be notified of their individual result by post as per previous years. All candidates are also able to access their results online via the Singapore Examinations and Assessment Board's (SEAB) results release system at www.seab.gov.sg.
3. 11,646 candidates sat for the 2020 GCE A-Level examination. 10,905 (93.6%) of these candidates have attained at least 3 H2 passes, with a pass in General Paper (GP) or Knowledge and Inquiry (KI).

Applications to Autonomous Universities

4. Interested applicants for admissions and/or scholarships to the Autonomous Universities (AUs) are encouraged to submit their applications online. All school candidates who apply to the AUs online do not need to submit a hard copy of their A-Level certificates. More information on the AUs' admissions processes can be found on their respective websites, and applicants can approach the AUs directly for further clarifications.

Applications to Polytechnics

5. Eligible A-Level graduates who are looking to further their studies at the polytechnics can benefit from module exemptions in 120 courses. This will reduce the time taken for them to obtain a polytechnic diploma by up to one year. Interested students can apply to the polytechnics directly in mid-August 2021, for matriculation in October 2021. More details will be made available on the respective polytechnics' websites by March 2021.
